Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" of the University of Burgundy

Open for the 2016-2017 academic year

The University of Burgundy according its international attractive politic, offers one scholarship for study at the Master's 2 level at the University of Burgundy in all disciplines proposed by The Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines"

Scholarship Value: 10 000 €

Eligibility:

- Foreign citizen
- Have a minimum of C1 level for the French language for law, economy, management and AES disciplines; B2 French language level required for all other disciplines
- hold Master's 1 degree or equivalent
- be enrolled as of 2015-2016 academic year at a eligible university designated by the Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" (link to the list)
- The Master 2 thesis subject should be relative to Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" themes

Terms and Conditions

- The scholar will be dispensed to the inscription fees at the university of Burgundy
- The scholar must cover his insurance and civil liability

Guidelines key dates

To be considered for a scholarship, an applicant must complete the following two-step process:

1) Complete and submit online application at the University of Burgundy

Applicants who are residents in a Campus France country with a CEF procedure (Algeria, Argentina, Bénin, Brasil, Burkina Faso, Cameroun, Chile, China, Colombia, Comores, Congo Brazzaville, Coréa, Côte d'Ivoire, Egypt, United States of America, Gabon, Guinéa, India, Indonésia, Iran, Japan, Liban, Madagascar, Mali, Morocco, Maurice, Mauritania, Mexico, Peru, Russia, Sénégal, Syria, Taiwan, Tunisia, Turkey, Vietnam)

Need to register an account to Campus France of his country before Mars 31, 2016

Applicants who are French resident or in a country without a Campus Frances CEF procedure (see Campus France website) need to apply directly at the web site of University of Burgundy from

February 2016 and precise that they apply for the Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" scholarship.

- 2) After enrollment at International Pole of the University of Burgundy, applicants must submit their application at the Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" Required documents for application:
 - Curriculum vitae
 - Copy and a certified translation of all degrees
 - Motivation lettre in french
 - Presentation (in two pages maximum) of the research topic
 - Recommendation letter(s)
 - French knowledge test certification TCF or a French language degree: DELF B2 for the disciplines requiring level B2 and DALF C1/C2 for disciplines requiring C1 level (1)
 - All other documents that could strength the application

Applicants will be contacted by the Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" by the end of June 2016 and the list of admitted scholaships will be published to the Unesco Chair "Culture and Traditions of Wines" web site (www-u-bourgogne.fr/chaireunesco-vinetculture).

(1) Are exempted from the language level justification, nationals of states where French is the official language: Belgique, Bénin, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroun, Canada, Comores, Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Gabon, Guinée, Guinée équatoriale, Haïti, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Mali, Maurice, Niger, République centrafricaine, République démocratique du Congo, Rwanda, Sénégal, Seychelles, Suisse, Tchad, Togo, Vuanatu. When French is not the only official language: the candidate must be able to justify that high school took place, in their entirety in a French-language institution
