- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within six weeks after the application deadline.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than six weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. Please note that some delays may occur due to national holidays or winter / summer vacation.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

The agreement will become operative on the date of signature of both universities and shall remain in force the full duration of the ERASMUS+ Programme. In case of a prior termination, a written notice of at least one academic year should be sent to the partner university. Any additions and/or amendments should be agreed upon in writing at least one academic year before it will come into effect. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
